



Compiling and Printing Your Garden Journal

This Garden Journal was designed for you to be able to personalize as your own with just a few forms to help you along the way.

Feel free to print as many copies of a specific page from the journal as needed. For example, if you are putting 5 or 6 different plants in your garden, simply print off 5 or 6 pages of the **Planting Log** for your use. The same for the plant or disease control page although hopefully you'll only need 1 or 2 of these pages at most. If you need a new planning/design grid for a new area, print off another of those also.

You can save *This Garden Journal* to your computer and print off pages as you need them. Then at the end of the gardening season each year, print off the other pages: *This Garden Journal belongs to:*, **The Garden Year in Review**, and **Looking Ahead to Next Year's Garden**. Add the **Gardening Quotes** page if you'd like or print out a copy of gardening quotes or poems you found and saved and would like to add to your journal for the year.

That's the beauty of *This Garden Journal* ... you can personalize it any way you'd like simply by adding additional pages of your own.

To print off individual pages of your journal:

1. Scroll to the page you want to print.
2. Under FILE, select PRINT.
3. Under PAGE RANGE, select CURRENT PAGE or enter the page number for the page you wish to print.
4. Then for COPIES, enter the Number of copies: you want printed.
5. Click on OKAY.
